Also, with Billy Long being gone, it didn't seem like a good time to create another vacancy.

However, I felt that if the vote went in favor of the ordinance, that I could assist in an orderly transition of the downtown, from depressed to thriving community with an actual economy. So I thought I would stay until such time as I actually couldn't participate (due to health). With last night's vote, I confess, I lost the interest.

It appears to me the most obvious, and only, way to boost our economy was to welcome this ordinance and all it might entail, knowing there'd be lots of work ahead. But this was dumped in our laps by the fates. We didn't ask for it. Since we personally believe recreational MJ is just around the bend, I thought we'd have accumulated some knowledge by then, to assist the transition. But just saying "NO" doesn't require any gain of knowledge.
